

# NO GAMES IN THE GRANTHAM PARKS ON SUNDAYS

Labour Party Application Rejected  
by the Town Council

MEMBERS' MAJORITY VOTE TO RETAIN QUIET  
ON THE SABBATH

Not a Question of Class Distinction?

DESCRIBED AS THE MOST CONTROVERSIAL AND REVOLUTIONARY SUBJECT WHICH HAS BEEN BEFORE THE AUTHORITY FOR MANY YEARS, GRANTHAM TOWN COUNCIL, ON WEDNESDAY, DEBATED THE VEXED QUESTION OF OPENING THEIR PARKS ON SUNDAYS FOR THE PURPOSES OF GAMES AND AMUSEMENTS.

The Council's parks committee recommended that such permission should be given, but the members were sharply divided on the subject. In brief, Councillor A. Roberts expressed the view of the majority that he was not prepared to barter away the peace, quietness and attractiveness of the parks on Sundays, while, in reply, Councillor W. Goodliff said that if it was right for the leisured classes to enjoy their Sunday golf and motoring surely it could not be wrong for other people to have their games?

On a vote being taken, the Council, by a majority of 14 to six, decided not to permit games in the parks on Sundays.
