GUADELOPE SUMMIT.

1. CALLING ON VANCE ON OTHER BUSINESS TODAY. I ASKED HIM FOR HIS
JUDGEMENT OF THE GUADELOPE SUMMIT, REMARKING THAT THE PRIME
MINSTER HAD BEEN VERY PLEASED WITH THE WAY IT HAD GONE. VANCE
SAID THAT SO TOO HAD THE PRESIDENT. MR CARTER HAD DESCRIBED IT AS
ONE OF THE BEST MEETINGS THAT HE HAD EVER ATTENDED AND HAD SAID
THAT HE THOUGHT THAT GISCARD HAD THOUGHT IT HAD GONE WELL TOO.
BUT MR CARTER HAD FELT THAT SCHMIDT HAD PERHAPS BEEN LESS
ENTHUSIASTIC THAN THE OTHER THREE. I REPLIED THAT THIS WAS
NOT OUR IMPRESSION, ALTHOUGH THE PRESS SEEMED KEEN TO MAKE OUT
THAT THE THREE EUROPEAN LEADERS HAD NOT BEEN ENTIRELY HAPPY
WITH MR CARTER'S POSITION ON EAST/WEST RELATIONS AND THEIR
MANAGEMENT. VANCE REPLIED THAT THE DISCUSSION OF THIS AT GUADELOUPE
HAD GONE WELL. THE PRESIDENT ATTACHED THE GREATEST IMPORTANCE
TO THE ISSUE AND HAD IT AT THE TOP OF HIS LIST OF PRIORITIES
FOR THE YEAR AHEAD.
