MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE FEDERATIVE
REPUBLIC OF BRAZIL, SENHOR JOÃO BAPTISTA FIGUEIREDO
TO THE RT HON. MRS MARGARET THATCHER, PRIME MINISTER
OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN
IRELAND

"I am most grateful to Your Excellency for your kind telegram of yesterday's date, May 11th.

It is encouraging to have a reaffirmation of the endeavour of the British Government to find a negociated solution for the question.

Bearing in mind, however, the growing military activity in the South Atlantic, which increases the risks of an armed confrontation of serious proportions, I wish to reiterate to Your Excellency the concern of my country, its Government and public opinion, that such risks might mar the diplomatic efforts now being made by the Secretary General of the United Nations, Mr Perez de Cuellar. Such occurrence, as Your Excellency can well imagine, could have serious and deep repercussions both in the American Continental picture as well as in the world.

I trust, therefore, that the parties to the question, in no moment should fail to adopt a flexible and constructive attitude within the present negociations in the United Nations, and I once again reaffirm the wishes of my country for a successful end for such efforts in the shortest possible period of time.
