The private meetings with also offer an opportunity to sound out. on steps they could take to assist the Nicaraguan recistance. Through intermediaries, we have been apprised that the Chilean government is prepared to provide up to 48 BLOWPIPS surface-to-air missiles to the freedom fighters.

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The Chileans indicate that they need to have permission from HMG to transfer these missiles which apparently were staged in Chile during the Falklands War. These weapons, or something similar (e.g., SA-7s), are essential if the resistance is to stay in the fight now that the Sandinistas are employing their Soviet-provided MI-24 HIND-D helicopters.

We should be supportive of any joint efforts to enhance the Bonn Declaration and improve the ability of the Western democracies to impose sanctions on those who fail to prosecute or extradite.

Lastly, you can commit to urge more expeditious treatment of extradition cases held in this country.

On the matter of supporting the Nicaraguan resistance, we should very privately express approbation for anything that is willing to do in support of their cause. At this point, the Chilean government has not yet approached on the matter of transfering the BLOWPIPE missiles. Further, the European country leader may not be fully aware of the constraints which have been levied on the CIA and BoD as a consequence of the FY85 Continuing Resolution. 

At Tab I is a memorandum from you to the President regarding several veryosensitive issues he may wish to raise to during the European forthcoming visit. Central America.

Several weeks ago, David Walker, a former SAS officer, now a reputable British Security Specialist, indicated a willingness to

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assist in special mission planning and training for the Niceraquan resistance. This approach was reported in a separate memorandum. Walker also informed that BLOWPIPE surface- to-air missiles may be available in Chile for use by the FDN in dealing with the HIND helicopters. This information was passed through an appropriate secure and source protected means to Adolfo Calero who proceeded immediately to Santiago. Yesterday, Calero, having returned from Chile, advised that the Chileans have possession of large quantities of BLOWPIPE missiles and that they are willing to make 48 missiles and five to eight launchers available to the FDN. There would be no charge for the missiles, but the Chileans did ask \$15K each for the launchers. The Chileans noted. however, that they obtain British permission for the transfer. Training on the weapons system was also offered for up to ten three-man teams from the FDN on a no-cost basis. Calero will dispatch the trainees to Chile on December 21. According to Calero, no one in the Pinochet government is aware that the USG has knowledge of this offer. The European visit provides an opportunity to address this issue directly without intermediaries. becoming aware.

Your memo to the President at Tab I brings these issues to his attention and asks that he discuss the matter of the Nicaraguan resistance very privately with the European country leader You will recall that before the June Summit we discussed the matter of the Buropean aid to the resistance and noted that

The European country leader has funds that might be available for such activities.

for such activities.

This may be the best opportunity we have to obtain such support for the resistance. Given recent actions in Nicaragua, we may not have another chance if we wait.
