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PUBLIC OPINION BACKGROUND NOTE 54

I attach a note setting out the results from our latest Gallup 'tracking' study. This survey was conducted from February 18th to 23rd and found a 6% Labour lead. The %% Conservative lead Gallup found in their published poll (conducted 10th/16th February) was probably just a freak result. Support for either a Social Democratic Party or a Social Democratic/Liberal alliance remains strong but has shown little change over the past three weeks.

1. Introduction

The interviewing for our latest Gallup tracking study was conducted from 18th until 23rd February 1981 and they found a 6% Labour lead. This 6% Labour lead compares with a ½% Conservative lead they found in their published survey (conducted 10/16 February). The level of support for either a Social Democratic Party or a Social Democratic/Liberal alliance showed almost no change according to our tracking questions. Details below:-

The 1/2% Conservative lead Gallup found in their published survey was almost certainly a freak result as our latest results show a return to a 6% Labour lead which is around the level that we have found since late January 1981 onwards. Liberal support remains high:

5. Published Polls

Audience Selection (Sun February 26th 1981)

An Audience Selection poll published in the Sun on 26th February 1981 and conducted by telephone on February 23rd looked at public attitudes to a range of social and political issues. They found:-

- 65% thinking Sunday football should be allowed.
- 72% thinking shops should be allowed to open on Sundays if they wish.
- 61% thought that Northern Ireland should be united with Eire 32% taking the view that Northern Ireland should remain part of UK
- -57% thought that we should withdraw our troops from Northern Ireland 40% that they should stay.
