As you know, Angus and I meet every week with Chris Patten and Adam Ridley on policy co-ordination. At our last meeting worry was expressed that you might be badgered, personally, to get involved with proposals for and contents of regional Manifestoes.

We expect that there will be pressures to have such Manifestoes in some, if not all, parts of the country. We would suggest that you should distance yourself from any such proposals and from the contents, and should simply say that you welcome the idea but that you can make no specific commitment and suggest that the proposals - or the draft - be sent to Angus and me.
