Your two letters of the 22 and 24 arrived just as I was on the point to send you two further possible addenda to Denat. of Money. The first typed one you will be able to decide where it fits in best either as a note or in the text - probably where I explicitly take issue with Milton in connection with indexation. The printed one I feel tempted to insert as an appendix with due credit to the author to whom you would have to write for permission. What do you feel about it.

My program is now fairly definite, provided my children have no objection about the date for which I have invited myself to Dartington. I shall leave here on the 11th, arrive at the Reform Club on the 13th, but stay at first only for two nights. I will then return from Devon on Monday the 19th for the recording of my BBC talks on the 20th and shall then stay until the end of that week or possibly even two or three days longer if this seems desirable to do the proofs of the 2nd edition. Though I do not think I shall have any further long addition, I have a whole batch of cards with notes which will probably lead to a number of one or two sentence insertions.

I am afraid I have promised to give a lecture at Freiburg on the 4th November and shall immediately afterwards start via New York, Hillsdale and New Orleans on a four weeks tour of South America. So I am afraid my participation in the Trade Union Seminar is not practicable. -- I was rather disappointed by the response to my Letters to The Times. Not a single good reply though I returned twice to the charge! A few private letters expressing relief that somebody has broken the silence - has really nobody the courage to speak up.
