WE HAVE A CRISIS, WHICH WILL NEED DRASTIC MEASURES TO RESOLVE, OVER THE SUPERVISON OF THE POLLING STATIONS.

- 2. IT WAS INITIALLY OUR THOUGHT THAT ABUSES WITHIN THE POLLING STATION (E.G. BY THE PRESIDING OFFICER) WOULD BE PREVENTED BY THE PRESENCE WITHIN THE POLLING STATION OF AGENTS OF THE POLITICAL PARTIES (SEE IN THIS CONNECTION PARAGRAPH 38 OF ANNEX D OF THE LANCASTER HOUSE AGREEMENT). IN ORDER TO PREVENT OVER-CROWDING IN THE STATIONS, MY ORDINANCE LAST MONTH, WHICH DEALT WITH A NUMBER OF PROCEDURAL QUESTIONS, LAID DOWN THAT THE PRESIDING OFFICER COULD RESTRICT THE NUMBERS OF PARTY AGENTS IN A POLLING STATION AT ANY ONE TIME TO FOUR, PROVIDED THERE WERE NOT LESS THAN THREE.
- 3. IT IS NOW REPRESENTED TO ME THAT THE PRESENCE OF A Z A N U (P F)
  AGENT WITHIN A POLLING STATION IS LIKELY TO HAVE A MARKEDLY
  INTIMIDATING EFFECT ON AN UNSOPHISTICATED VOTER. I THEREFORE
  BELIEVE THAT I SHALL NOW HAVE TO BAN PARTY AGENTS FROM POLLING
  STATIONS ALTOGETHER, AT LEAST IN ALL EXCEPT THE URBAN AREAS.
  4. WHEN I DO THAT, HOWEVER, I IMMEDIATELY LAY OUR WHOLE SYSTEM
  OF SUPERVISION OPEN TO THE SERIOUS CRITICISM, BY THE OBSERVER
  AND OTHERS, THAT WE ARE NOT EXERCISING ADEQUATE CONTROL: AND THAT,
  FOR EXAMPLE, THERE IS NOTHING TO PREVENT A PRESIDING OFFICER,
  WITH THE CONNIVANCE OF HIS CLERKS, STUFFING A BALLOT BOX WITH
  FALSELY MARKED PAPERS. I FEAR THE CONSEQUENCES OF SUCH CRITICISM
  WOULD BE VERY SERIOUS. THE ONLY SOLUTION I CAN SEE WOULD BE TO
  HAVE A BRITISH AGENT AT EACH OF THE RURAL AND EACH OF THE MOBILE
  POLLING STATIONS SAY 500 ALTOGETHER.

5. THIS TASK WOULD THEREFORE REQUIRE THE DEPLOYMENT TO RHODESIA
OF ABOUT 500 YOUNG MEN, WHO WOULD HAVE TO BE PREPARED TO LIVE
FAIRLY ROUGH FOR A WEEK (CAMP BEDS IN E.G. SCHOOLS OR POLICE
STATIONS, AND COMPO RATIONS). ON A ROUGH INITIAL CALCULATION
THEY WOULD HAVE TO ARRIVE IN SALISBURY ON MONDAY MORNING, 25
FEBRUARY, AND COULD PROBABLY BE FLOWN OUT AGAIN A WEEK LATER. THER
WOULD HAVE NO EXECUTIVE TASK. THEIR ROLE WOULD BE PARTLY DETERRENT,
PARTLY PRESENTATIONAL. THEY WOULD BE GIVEN FAIRLY SIMPLE AND
STRAIGHTFORWARD BRIEFING IN SALISBURY ON ARRIVAL. GIVEN THE SHORT
NOTICE, AND THE NATURE OF THE TASK, IT SEEMS TO ME THAT ONLY
OR
MILITARY OF POLICE COULD MEET THE REQUIREMENT.

6. WE HAVE DISCUSSED THIS WITH GENERAL ACLAND, BUT HE DOESN'T
FEEL HE WOULD BE ABLE TO SPARE ANY MEN FROM THE MONITORING FORCE
AT THAT TIME. I HAVE THEREFORE TO ASK THAT URGENT CONSIDERATION
BE GIVEN TO FULFILLING THIS REQUEST FROM MILITARY OR POLICE
RESOURCES IN THE U K OR ELSEWHERE. THE MEN CONCERNED WOULD HAVE
TO BE RESPONSIBLE ENOUGH IF NECESSARY TO ASSERT THEMSELVES, ON

1. FOLLOWING IS TEXT OF BROADCAST

BEGINS

TO ALL Z A N L A FORCES I REX NHONGO, DEPUTY SECRETARY OF DEFENCE OF Z A N U P F AM GIVING YOU THESE ORDERS WHICH MUST BE OBEYED - WHICH COME FROM OUR PRESIDENT OF Z A N U P F. COMMANDER IN CHIEF OF Z A N L A, COMRADE PRESIDENT ROBERT G MUGABE. THE ORDERS ARE AS FOLLOWS:-

1. ALL Z A N L A FORCES IN ASSEMBLY PLACES ARE STRICTLY ORDERED NOT TO LEAVE THE AREAS IN WHICH THEY ARE. THEY ARE ORDERED TO FOLLOW THE RULES THAT THEY HAVE BEEN GIVEN: AND EVERY DAY THEY ARE

TO AGREE TO ROLL CALLS.

2. ALL Z A N L A MEMBERS WHO HAVE NOT YET GONE TO ASSEMBLY PLACES ARE ORDERED TO GO TO TOSE AREAS IMMEDIATELY. TO ASSIST YOU IN THESE MATTERS WE ARE SENDING YOU SOME OF YOUR COMMANDERS TO DIFFERENT PLACES FOR THEM TO GIVE YOU ADVICE WHICH MUST BE FOLLOWED.

3. OUR SIDE MUST NOT BREAK THE AGREEMENT WHICH IS THERE IN REGARD OF PEACE WHICH WE ARE COMPELLED TO FOLLOW IN CONNECTION WITH THE CEASEFIRE. WE ARE COMPELLED ALSO NOT TO PREVENT OR INTERFERE WITH MEETINGS OF OTHER PARTIES NOT BEING OURS WHEN THEY CALL THEIR MEETINGS. WE HAVE SUBMITTED OURSELVES TO RESPECT THE OTHER PARTIES AND THEY IN TURN RECIPROCATE THE RESPECT TOWARDS US.

4. OUR AGREEMENT IS THAT THERE SHOULD BE PEACEFUL ELECTIONS, AND THAT OUR PEOPLE SHOULD VOTE NICELY AND WITHOUT FIGHTING. OUR ORGANISATION HAS AGREED TO ACCEPT THE RESULT OF THE ELECTION WHICH WILL BE SHOWN BY WISHES OF THE PEOPLE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THEIR VOTE. THESE ORDERS MUST BE OBEYED. THAT IS ALL.
