- 1. You spoke to me recently about the letter which you had received from the Chairmen of the four major national performing arts companies.
- 2. I recently received a deputation from the directors. They are obviously very concerned about the future, given what they already know about the arts budget from the Public Expenditure White Paper. MISC 62 have now agreed that the cut in the arts programme is to be less severe than was originally proposed, and there will be no need for drastic reductions. But even so cash grants will fall short of what is needed to keep pace with costs and there may be as much as a further 3 or 4 per cent squeeze on these companies in real terms. This will very difficult but probably just about manageable. The same is true for all the arts bodies, from the British Museum downwards. But I am afraid that the present arts budget makes that inevitable.
- 3. The Chairmen would of course very much like to see you. But if this is not possible I will certainly do so, and send you a report.
- 4. My Private Secretary is sending a draft reply to the letter.
