PRIME MINISTER

Since we are both rather busy and out of London much of the time in the immediate future, I thought I would let you have a brief progress report on the policy work front.

- As we agreed the other day, I have written to Max Beloff and Messrs Higgins, 2. Renton and Wickenden to invite them to be chairmen. They have all accepted subject to survey and contract. I have already talked to Beloff and Renton, and hope to talk to the other two as soon as timetables permit.
- I have written to the colleagues concerned to underline very clearly the need for 3. regional balance in indentifying possible members and chairmen, and they have already responded with a number of useful suggestions. I know you had some anxiety about the chairmanship of the Family Policy Group. The investigations we've made have shown that we can come up with a well-balanced array of members for it, whether one looks at their professional or regional background. I hope you will feel reassured by this, so that we can go ahead with the group as originally planned. I should personally find it very difficult to do otherwise. We could of course have a word about the issue next week if you wish.
- All the groups will, of course, be operating within very strict instructions about the need to avoid proposing any net increases in public expenditure.
