BACKGROUND BRIEFING ON YOUNG CONSERVATIVES by Tim Cowell.

The attendance is the best for years - over 1250 tickets have been issued to the YCs, plus 250 to the Local Associations. The dramatic increase in numbers attending is an indication of the improvement that has occurred in the fortunes of the organisation. Phil Pedley, the Chairman, and his fellow officers took our advice and gave the recruitment of members and the creation of new branches top priority among their activities. Politically they maintained the campaigns, particularly on "Peace and Defence" debating with, and defeating CND.

The Conference Agenda reflects many of the important issues that concern younger members of the Party and provides an opportunity for the achievements of the Government to be outlined to the YC's and public at large. In particular the debate on the Youth Training Scheme will enable us to encourage YCs to assist Ministers in the coming months with the promotion of this crucial policy. aspects of "Defence and Disarmament" will be covered on the Saturday afternoon and the film the "Peace Game" should be well received. Mr Michael Heseltine is not speaking on defence as such, but I have no doubt that he will mention this during his Presidential Address. The motion on "defence" could be more helpful, but I am hopeful that it will be heavily defeated. The other debates and speeches will provide a varied "menu" for representatives and the opportunity to hear Lord Home speak on "International affairs" will conclude a topical weekend.
