Thank you for your letter of 9 December about Caroline Cox and John Marks and their research.

I am pleased that you have been able to set the record straight. In these exceptional circumstances, it was absolutely right to give the House a written statement of the Department's views on the research work of the National Council for Educational Standards.

It is also encouraging to learn that your Department is now urgently assessing possibilities for further research before deciding whether to commit public funds to it. Like you, I hope that it will be possible to consider the outcome early in the New Year, since I understand that the NCES's need for funds is very pressing indeed.
