Dear Arthur,,

I do indeed regard the awandonment of the whole macroeconomics nonsense as very important, but it is for me a very delicate matter and I have for some time avoided stating my views too bluntly ly and would not have time to state them adequately. The source of the difficulty is the constant danger that the Mont Pelerin society might split into a Friedmanite and a Hayekian wing. I have long regretted my failure to take time to critizise Friedman's Positive Economics almost as much as my failure to return to the critique of Keynes General Theory after I had dealt with his Treatiese. It still seems to me paradoxical that Keynes, who was rather contemptuous of econometrics, should have become the main source of the revival of macroeconomics which incidentally was also the reason why Milton was for a time a Keynesian. I believe a goo and detailed critical analysis of marcroeconomics would be very desirable, but at the moment I do not know whom to suggest as the person who could do it really well, possibly Lachmann, although I fear he may also be aging, though not as much as Hutt of whom I would have thought in this connection ten years ago. Victor Vanberg might be another possibility. I will let you know if another name occurs to me.
