Following your meeting with the Prime Minister last evening, I am writing to confirm that she decided that we would not ask any Foreign "Conservative" to address the Party Conference in Brighton on 8th October 1982.

The Prime Minister also decided that she would not be present at the EDU Meeting in Paris at the beginning of July 1982.

I take it that you will approach Peter Carrington about him going to that Conference.

The Prime Minister said that she would be glad to meet M. Chirac when he was next in London, and suggested that she might give a lunch for him. You said that the Foreign Office would be quite happy about this.

Could you let me know, please, as soon as possible, when M. Chirac is likely to be in London?
