PUBLIC OPINION BACKGROUND NOTE 74

I attach a note setting out the main results from our latest Gallup 'tracking' study. The interviewing for this survey was conducted from 15th until 20th July and found a sizeable jump in the level of support for the Social Democrats. We will be watching closely to see whether this marks the start of a major movement of support to them.

PUBLIC OPINION BACKGROUND NOTE 74

1. Introduction

Gallup conducted the interviewing for our latest 'tracking' study from 15th until 20th July - mostly after the result of the Warrington by-election was known. The survey found an increase in the level of unprompted support for the Social Democrats - it increased from 12% in the week 8/13 July to 17% in the latest study. The gurvey found almost no change in the level of support for the Conservative Party but a drop from 40½% to 36% in the level of support for Labour. The next effect of these changes was to reduce Labour's lead over the Conservatives from 10½% in the week 8/13 July to 7% in the week 15/20 July. It should be noted that these figures have been calculated on the same basis as the Gallup figures published in the Daily Telegraph - they exclude electors who claim they did not know how they would vote.

The tables below show the level of support (including don't knows as a separate category) Gallup found in response to our three standard voting intention questions:-

- (a) the standard voting intention question
- (b) how electors claimed they would vote when the idea of a Social Democrat candidate was specifically mentioned.
- (c) how electors claimed they would vote when the idea of a Social Democrat-Liberal Alliance candidate was specifically mentioned.
