Too much has gone wrong in Britain for us to hope to put it all right in a year or so. Most people want to be told the truth and to be given a clear lead towards the action needed for recovery".

3. We are some times not sufficiently vigorous in proclaiming our achievements. We are often much too defensive. There are more than 250 trumpeters for the Conservative cause here this afternoon and this is no time for any of the trumpets to give an uncertain sound.
