Public Opinion Background Note 24

I attach a copy of the results from our latest Gallup "tracking" study. The interviewing for this research was conducted from 2nd to 7th July and Gallup found a 7% Labour lead compared with the 8% lead we found in our previous tracking study. It would appear that Labour's lead has stabilised again at around 7/8% compared with the 4% level it stabilised at during June.

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Public Opinion Background Note 24 (Produced 11th July 1980)

1. Introduction

Our latest Gallup "tracking" study conducted from 2nd to 7th July found a 7% Labour lead compared with the 8% Labour lead we found in the previous week. (25/30 June 1980). It would appear from the results from our latest two tracking studies that Labour's lead has stabilised at a higher level than in the period 4th to 23rd June when it remained almost constant for three weeks at around 4%.

Voting Intention

Full details of the trend in support for the main parties from both published Gallup polls and our unpublished Gallup "tracking" studies are shown both in the table below and in the attached graphs. It is perhaps worth noting that the Telegraph is likely to be publishing the results from the next weekly Gallup poll next Thursday (July 17th).

The 7% Labour lead in our latest tracking study can be compared with Labour's 18% lead in June 1971, 21%% lead in July 1971, 4%% lead in August 1971 and 19% lead in September 1971.

3. Government Record

No change from previous week in popularity of Government - 31% of the electorate approves of our record to date. In June 1971 only 22% of the electorate approved of the Conservative Government's record, 26% in July 1971, 39% in August 1971 and 30% in September 1971.

4. Popularity of Political Leaders

Our latest tracking study found 38% of the electorate satisfied with Mrs. Thatcher's record as Prime Minister compared with 45% satisfied with Mr. Callaghan as Leader of the Opposition. There has been a sharp downward movement in Callaghan's popularity in recent months from the peak reached in early May when 57% of the electorate approved of his record as Leader of the Opposition. Our latest study also found a sharp improvement in Mr. Steel's popularity - we need to await our next survey before attempting to draw any conclusions from this.

Details of trends in popularity of the three main political leaders are shown in the table below and on the attached graphs.

5. Issues

In recent tracking studies we have been asking our respondents for their views on a range of current issues in terms of whether the issues make them more favourably inclined towards the Government, less favourably inclined or they make no difference. The issues we include in this question are based on the answers to our standard open-ended tracking question, "Over the last seven days have you seen or heard anything that has made you feel more favourably or less favourably inclined towards the Government". Details of the answers we have obtained in the past four weeks are shown on page 4.

Remarkably little change in public reactions to the various issues we included in this "tracking" question - the only issue on which we have a lead in terms of favourability to the Government is with regard to Trade Union Reform.
