

- i) Introduce a staged progression to the payment of full economic rents by those able to afford them;
- ii) Review the provision of the Housing (Homeless Persons) Act 1977 and the Rent (Agriculture) Act 1976;
- iii) Amend the Rent Act 1977 to encourage the availability of privately rented accommodation."
