The interviewing for our latest 'tracking' study was from 13th until 18th May 1981. The research found no major change in the support for the Social Democrats - at present there is no sign of an upturn in support for them. Support for the Liberals also remains stable.

1. Introduction

The interviewing for our latest Gallup 'tracking' study was conducted from 13th until 18th May. The survey found no major changes from the previous study, in particular it found no sign of an upturn in support for the Social Democrats after the downward trend in support for them in recent weeks. Support for the Liberals also remaining constant.

The tables below and attached graphs show the trend in support for the main parties from early March for:-

(a) the standard voting intention question (the term Social Democrat is not mentioned in the question)

(b) how the electorate said they would vote if a Social Democratic candidate was standing

(c) how the electorate said they would vote if a candidate for a Social Democratic/Liberal alliance stood.

It should be noted that the published figures on voting intention exclude don't knows (the figures are re-calculated) the tables below do not.

2. Standard Voting Intention

The standard Gallup voting intention question (excluding don't knows) found a marginal improvement in the position of the Conservative and Labour parties and a very slight fall in support for the Liberals and Social Democrats.

Labour lead us by 2% (13/18 May) compared with 3% in the previous published poll conducted 6/11 May.
